TrueCare History

- Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC)
- Originally called North County Health Services
- Founded in 1971 serving Agricultural Workers through Mobile Unit in rural San Diego, CA
- Opened first healthcare center in 1974
- We're still growing!





Trends & Observations

TrueCare Patients

- 58,000 Patients
- 60% Medi-Cal
- 4,133 Ag workers
- 39% served in a language other than English

Top Health Concerns

- Chronic Diseases (Diabetes, Obesity, Hypertension)
- Arthritis
- Illnesses related to pesticides

Top Barriers

- Access (lack of insurance)
- Language/Literacy
- Transportation


