Eligibility: Nonprofit organizations with evidence of IRS 501 (c) (3) designation

Award Amount: \$25,000-50,000

Length of Funding: Not stated

Purpose: The obesity proposal category seeks to fund community-based health education, prevention, and early detection efforts aimed at fighting obesity. Health Literacy proposals must incorporate and/or demonstrate impact in one or more of the following: plain language approach to communications; public education and awareness programs; and/or training and education for health care professionals, staff, and patients.

Robert Wood Johnson Foundation - Project HealthDesign: Rethinking the Power and Potential of Personal Health Records

Due Date: brief proposal 06/03/09

Eligibility: Applicants for this round of funding may be either public entities, nonprofit organizations that are tax-exempt under Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and are not private foundations as defined under Section 509 (a), or for-profit entities.

Available Funding: \$ 2,400,000

Number of Awards: 5

Award Amount: \$200,000 – 500,000

Length of Funding: 2 years

Purpose: Grant recipients will work to assess and test the potential of observations of daily life (ODLs) to help patients and physicians better manage chronic illnesses. Funded teams will work closely with patients and providers across different care settings to demonstrate how health data from everyday life — meals, sleep, exercise levels, pain episodes, and even moods — can be collected, interpreted, and integrated into the clinical care process.

American Academy of Pediatrics: Community Access to Child Health Program Planning Funds

Due Date: 07/31/2009

Eligibility: Pediatricians in the U.S. and its territories

Available Funding: Not stated

Award Amount: \$2,500 to \$12,000

Purpose: plan community-based initiatives that increase children's access to medical homes or to specific health services not otherwise available. Planning project activities must lead to sustainable, community-based child health initiatives that increase access to care, especially for underserved children, and address health disparities among children.

HRSA - HIV Early Intervention Services (EIS) Program

Due Date: 07/01/2009

Eligibility: This competition is open to Part C EIS grantees with project periods ending December 31, 2009, and new organizations proposing to replace the current grantee. New organizations must demonstrate that they will serve the existing patients, populations, scope of services and service areas currently served by the grantee they intend to replace. Eligible entities include public or private non-profit entities.

Available Funding: \$8,560,866

Number of Awards: 12

Award Amount: \$358,000

Length of Funding: up to 5 years

Purpose: The purpose of this funding is to provide, on an ongoing outpatient basis, high quality early intervention services/primary care to individuals with HIV infection. These services become part of a continuum of HIV prevention and care for individuals who are at risk for HIV infections or are HIV infected. All early intervention services (EIS) programs must provide: HIV counseling and testing; counseling and education on living with HIV; appropriate medical evaluation and clinical care; and other essential services such as oral health care, outpatient mental health services, outpatient substance abuse services and nutritional services, and appropriate referrals for specialty services.

Eligibility: Applicants are limited to public or private nonprofit entities that are currently funded Part C programs whose project periods expire on December 31, 2008 or March 31, 2009 and new organizations proposing to replace the current grantee.

Award Amount: average size \$358,000

Length of Funding: Not stated

Purpose: The purpose of this funding is to provide, on an ongoing outpatient basis, high quality early intervention services/primary care to individuals with HIV infection. Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Local Funding Partnerships

Due Date: 07/07/2009

Eligibility: Projects must be new, innovative, collaborative and community-based. Significant program expansions—into new regions or to new populations—may also be considered. Please note that these funds may not be used to maintain existing projects. Projects must be nominated by a local grantmaker committed to participating as one of the funding partners. Local funding partners must be willing to work with grantees to obtain sufficient dollar-for-dollar matching funds throughout the grant period. Matching funds must represent new funding specifically designated to support the proposed project. In-kind services may not be used to match Foundation funds.

Award Amount: \$200,000 – 500,000

Purpose: Funding for promising, original projects that can significantly improve the health of vulnerable people in their communities.
