Regular source of medical care	Possibly	Emergency rooms (not farmworker specific)			X	To determine how many people are not using the health center. <i>Depending on the objective of the needs assessment, knowing the number of people reporting not having a medical home can be useful for:</i> a) <i>determining C/MHC penetration rate</i> b) <i>determining the number of farmworkers using emergency rooms for non-emergencies</i> c) <i>determining the number of people with no access to primary care, etc.</i> d) <i>supporting need for service expansion or for establishing a new access point</i>
