

Ag Worker Client Profile

Instructions: Identify your Agricultural worker client groups in which individuals of the group share some similarities, in any of the following factors: type of agricultural work, gender, age, culture, or physical location (i.e. housing unit, neighborhood, or employment location). For example, you may have a group of male Agricultural workers in a certain age range working in animal farms; female Agricultural workers working in a certain crop; H-2A workers, etc. For each of these client groups, develop profiles for groups of individuals by gender, age (teen to young adult; adult; elderly), and ethnicity/culture.

There are other factors you can add for each of the profiles such as language, socioeconomic status (SES), education/literacy level, etc., all of which are important to provide quality care. For example, one of your client profiles could be adult Latino males who speak Spanish and Mixteco as their primary languages. They work in crops 3 months out of the year, then work in animal farms 4 months out of the year and then may work 1 month in construction in different locations and at different times of the year.
