

Texas Agricultural Workers




- 15 health centers are designated Migrant Health Centers

- 44% claimed a person in their household received assistance from Medicaid²

Texas Medicaid



- 5.9 million Medicaid enrollees
 - o **2.7 million** appear to be ineligible

- 32% of health center patients have Medicaid
 - o 12% of the Texas Medicaid population
 - Medicaid beneficiaries will begin to lose coverage on June
 1, 2023


