THE COVID-19 VACCINE

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN I GET IT?

Everyone has the right to get vaccinated!



After getting the vaccine:

- It's possible that you'll feel fine, or that you will have pain in your arm, headache, fever, chills, nausea, muscle pain, or tiredness for 1-3 days.
- If you are going to move for work in the next few weeks, ask the clinic to write down the brand name of the vaccine.



Step 2

If you get a vaccine that requires two doses:


- You'll need to get the second dose 3-8 weeks after the first one.
- You should receive both doses to avoid getting very sick with COVID-19.





After getting all the doses needed:

- **Get the booster shots** when you become eligible to have better protection against new variants.
- Wear a mask if you have had contact with anyone infected with COVID-19 or if there is a high risk of COVID-19 spread in your community.
- Get tested for COVID-19 if you feel any symptoms (cough, fever, etc.).
