HOW TO CARE FOR YOUR BABY IF YOU HAVE COVID-19

Take into account the following recommendations:

- Stay at home.
- Isolate from other household members.
- Ask a family member or someone you trust who is not sick to care for your baby.
- DO NOT put a mask on your baby.

If you have help

- Wash your hands with soap and water for 20 seconds or use alcohol-based hand sanitizer frequently.
- Wear a mask in shared spaces.
- Keep your baby at least 2 meters from you as much as possible.
- Pump breastmilk so that the person you trust feeds the baby from a bottle.
- Sterilize bottle and breast pump parts after each use.



If you don't have help

- Wash your hands with soap and water for 20 seconds or use alcohol-based hand sanitizer before and after touching the baby.
- Wear a mask when caring for the baby.
- Sterilize bottle after each use.
- Clean and disinfect surfaces regularly.



When is it safe to end your isolation period?

- You can leave your home after 5 full days if you are fever-free without the use of fever-reducing medication and your symptoms are improving.
- You must wear a snug high-quality mask (N95 or KN95) covering nose and mouth for 10 days when in contact with other people.

If you are sick with COVID-19, you must recover before you can get the vaccine. You may continue to breastfeed after receiving the first or second COVID-19 vaccine.
